Mitigation Strategies and Techniques to Reduce Impacts

- Any units immediately adjacent to highway require a predicted LVORI at 7 or less for that night, as well as wind with an eastern component, at least 5 mph through the following morning.
- . Units located along the installation boundary will require a W to NW wind direction to be burned.
- Run V-Smoke model to ensure smoke sensitive receptors won't be affected.
